Follow this plan precisely for maximum success. Companies that deviate from the timeline often experience delays and additional costs. Work the steps in order and keep the documentation current as you go.

⚠ COMMON PITFALLS & HOW TO AVOID THEM

⚠ Top 8 COR Implementation Mistakes

1. **Inadequate management commitment** - Ensure senior leadership actively participates
2. **Poor documentation organization** - Use systematic document control procedures
3. **Insufficient training records** - Maintain detailed competency documentation
4. **Incomplete hazard assessments** - Cover all workplace activities and locations
5. **Weak contractor management** - Implement robust prequalification systems
6. **Inadequate incident investigation** - Investigate all incidents for root causes
7. **Missing performance metrics** - Track leading and lagging safety indicators
8. **Rushed implementation** - Allow sufficient time for cultural change

✅ Best Practices for Success

- Assign dedicated resources for implementation
- Use experienced consultants for guidance
- Involve workers in hazard identification and control
- Conduct regular internal audits
- Maintain open communication throughout the process
- Celebrate milestones and achievements
